- I still recommend the home groups and members look into the need of cooperation with the elderly community, or a special needs committee. And if this is something that should possibly be a subcommittee of H & I or a stand alone committee, if needed at all. I have attached some useful information.
- I will be putting in place some guidelines for the different aspects of the BTG Subcommittee. If you would like to be apart of this, please attend the BTG Subcommittee meeting held on the first Saturday of the month next to Meridian Bowling Lanes.
